Description:

The Woodstock Inn & Resort, a Preferred Hotel, is a charming, luxury four-season resort hotel set against a backdrop of breathtaking scenery ideal for enjoying New England's finest cultural and sporting activities. Resort facilities include the Suicide Six downhill ski area, The Resort's Nordic Center, Golf Club, and a 41,000 square foot Racquet & Fitness Club. In September 2010, the Resort will unveil The Spa at Woodstock Inn & Resort, featuring locally inspired treatments and products in a brand-new facility.

Location:

Woodstock is located in the Green Mountains near the center of Vermont. The Woodstock Inn & Resort faces the heart of town - the Village Green - with shops, restaurants, and area attractions just a short walk from the lobby.

The Resort is conveniently located with nearby access to I-89 (heading north to Burlington, south to New Hampshire and Boston) and I-91 (heading south to Hartford). The Resort is a 2 ½ -hour drive from Boston, 2 ½ -hour drive from Hartford, 2 ½ hours from Albany, NY and 4 ½ hour trip from New York City metro area.

Ski Areas: Woodstock is 25 minutes from Killington, 40 minutes from Okemo and one hour from Sugarbush.

Affiliations: Preferred Hotels & Resorts, the ultimate luxury collection featuring more than 185 exceptional hotels and resorts in the most desirable locations around the world.

Accommodations: 142 guest rooms were recently renovated in 2008/09. All rooms are outfitted in classic Vermont style with modern touches, from the colorful hand-dyed wool blankets to the Vermont original artwork. Plush bathrobes and Vermont made bath amenities are found in each marble bathroom. Fireplaces are cozy and romantic fixtures in 23 of the Inn's guest rooms.

Spa: The Spa at The Woodstock Inn & Resort, opening this Fall, will restore mind, body, and soul with nourishing treatments and seasonal offerings in concert with nature that bring wellness, relaxation, and bliss. The Spa will feature organic products, nature-inspired ambiance and a list of amenities including: VIP restoration suite, enclosed outdoor courtyard, wood sauna, fire pit, hot soaking pool, and a meditation tree.

Recreation: Racquet & Fitness Club is a 41,000 square-foot multi-recreational facility which includes:

- Complete Cybex strength training and aerobic fitness equipment area
- 1,700 square foot aerobic class fitness room
- 30'x 60' indoor lap pool
- Whirlpool, coed steam room and sauna area
- One Racquetball Court
- One 600 square foot personal training studio
- Two indoor tennis courts
- Four outdoor hard tennis courts
- Six outdoor clay tennis courts
- Two paddle tennis court
- One Knox Meadows activity field with a sand volleyball court and Two horseshoe pits
- Two croquet courts

Other recreational activities include:

- Biking- Scenic bike paths wind through the surrounding towns and villages. Bike and helmet rentals available.
- Horseback Riding- Kedron Valley Stables feature an indoor arena, trail riding tours and other equestrian services.
- Canoeing & Kayaking- Kayak or canoe down the Connecticut River or across local Dewey Pond.
- Fishing- Vermont's swift-running, gravel bottom streams are ideal for cold-water fishing. Brook, rainbow, brown trout, bass, and pike are all ready to bite.
- Swimming- Nearby rivers, streams and swimming areas offer a place to cool down.

Golf: The Golf Club, just a five-minute walk from The Inn along South Street, is the site of the oldest golf course in Vermont, dating back to 1895. The 18-

hole par 70 course was redesigned in the 1960s by Robert Trent Jones, Sr. To play the course, golfers have to go over water 12 times. There is a practice range, a practice green, a putting green, a fully equipped Pro Shop, electric golf carts, and a professional staff to provide in-depth instruction.

Ski: Suicide Six offers a family-friendly downhill experience complete with rentals, lessons and a quaint lodge for après ski relaxation. Two chair lifts and a J-bar serve 23 trails. Full and half-day lift tickets are available, as well as season tickets. There is terrain for skiers of all levels- beginner, intermediate and expert. For a bigger mountain thrill, two top-rated New England Ski Areas, Okemo Mountain and Killington Resort, are just miles away.

The Woodstock Inn Nordic Center is a prime destination for cross-country skiers. The Nordic Center maintains some 60 kilometers of trails in the area-half of which are part of the Marsh-Billings-Rockefeller National Historical Park.

Dining Options: **The Red Rooster**, opened in August 2008, and offers a AAA Four Diamond dining experience under the direction of Chef Jason Lawless. It is open for lunch and dinner with menus that draw from the best purveyors in New England, emphasizing fresh, local ingredients - including specialty cheeses, shellfish, and heirloom fruits and vegetables - that are perfectly prepared.

Main Dining Room serves up hearty, Vermont-style breakfasts. Waffles pancakes, eggs, and real maple syrup are just a few wake-up delights. Enjoy fresh brewed coffee and the morning paper while overlooking The Green.

Richardson's Tavern is located in The Tavern Wing and is named after the original owner of The Woodstock Inn- Captain Richardson. Richardson's Tavern features live music, a light menu, and a fireplace to provide guests with a warm ambiance.

Fairway offers casual outdoor dining for lunch at the Golf Course.

Out of Bounds, during the winter months, provides savory homemade soups, hearty sandwiches, and fresh salads slope-side at Suicide-Six Ski Area. An indoor/outdoor fireplace and a full bar make this the perfect place to kick back après ski.

Technology: All rooms feature wireless high-speed Internet access, work area with desk, dual-line phones and voicemail message systems.

Day Excursions:

- Village of Woodstock with many art galleries, eclectic shops, restaurants, church steeples and historic architecture
- Marsh-Billings-Rockefeller National Historical Park is Vermont's only national park. It offers 45 miles of beautiful carriage roads, hiking trails through 400-year-old hemlock forests and a Junior Ranger Program for kids.
- Billings Farm and Museum is a working turn-of-the-20th-century dairy farm where children can experience first-hand the care of cows, sheep, horses, and chickens, and even see the afternoon milking up close. The Farm hosts special events year-round.
- Vermont Institute of Natural Sciences (VINS) is a rescue center for some 20 species of raptors including falcons, hawks, eagles and owls.
- Montshire Museum of Science, in Norwich, is a interactive children's science museum complete with nature trails, educational programs and day camps.
- The Quechee Gorge, referred to as Vermont's "Little Grand Canyon," is located seven miles east of Woodstock in Quechee, Vermont.
- President Calvin Coolidge State Historic Site, located in Plymouth, VT is the birthplace of the 30th President of the United States. Visitors can take a glimpse at his home as it was in the late 1800s.

Transportation:

Woodstock is a 20-minute drive from the airport at Lebanon, New Hampshire, which is served by a number of commuter airlines from Boston, New York and Burlington, Vermont. Interstates 89 (from the Boston area) and 91 (from Hartford, CT) intersect only 15 minutes from Woodstock.

Amtrak stops daily at White River Junction, 14 miles from Woodstock.
